Air Pollution FAQ



# Air pollution is a problem in Scotland

There are 34 Air Quality Management Areas in Scotland which have pollution levels damaging to human health.<sup>1</sup>

#### Am I at risk?

**Yes.** It is especially harmful to children, older people, pregnant women and people with existing health conditions. Air pollution is often worse in innercity areas increasing inequalities in health.

### Can it affect my health?

**Yes.** It can cause acute harm to our heart and lungs and chronic harm to every organ in the body. It is linked to pregnancy loss, premature birth, low birth weight and can affect lung development.<sup>2</sup>

#### Can it be fatal?

**Yes.** It is considered the biggest environmental health risk across Europe.<sup>3</sup> In the UK it is linked to 28,000 – 36,000 attributable deaths per year.<sup>4</sup>

Air pollution is linked to over 1700 premature deaths a year in Scotland.5

#### What causes air pollution?

**Traffic** is the number one cause of air pollution in Scotland.6 Other sources include domestic wood burning and industrial facilities such as power plants, refineries, factories and agriculture.

#### Is my air pollution monitored?

Possibly. There is live air monitoring from 99 sites around Scotland which can be found on this website.

#### What is the **Scottish Government** doing?

Cleaner Air For Scotland 2 is Scotland's strategy to comply with EU<sup>7</sup> and UKwide air quality standards.8 This includes Low Emission Zones in Aberdeen. Dundee. Edinburgh and Glasgow.

**Environmental Standards** Scotland has required the Government to take action to address breaches of air quality standards. These will need to be implemented effectively.
