

SIMD rank of enquiries

The Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) is a relative measure of deprivation across 6,976 small areas. This was recorded for 185 of the 325 enquiries. It was not recorded for enquiries from organisations or which were signposted to other services.



- 1-20% most deprived areas
- 21-40% most deprived areas
- 41-60% most deprived areas
- 21-40% least deprived areas
- 1-20% least deprived areas
